Bike Shelter

The bike shelter within the school grounds is unfortunately presenting us with a number of issues on a daily basis. The plastic/ acrylic cover has become very brittle in sunlight and has cracked in several places, with a very large price (several thousand pounds) to get this repaired which we are unable to



do due to severe budget cuts. The bikes and scooters are also proving to be very tempting for some children when outside, who take them from the shelter until asked by staff to return them.

It is therefore with regret that we are having the bike shelter removed from within the playground, with the bike mounts being relocated to the area adjacent to the kitchen doors outside of the gates. This will mean you will need to bring a lock for any bicycles/ scooters as they will not be within the locked playground perimeter. The bike shelter will be out of use from Wednesday this week, as we prepare for it to be removed and make sure it is empty.

This has not been an easy decision, as we love the fact so many children bike/ scoot to school, but we would still encourage you to continue to do so but ensuring it is locked at the beginning of the day.

Collecting Children

We have been asked a few times whether other family members or siblings can collect children on your behalf. Our procedures for collection are that older siblings can collect on your behalf, but need to be over 13 years old to take responsibility. If a member of staff is unsure of the age of the person, it may be the case that your child will be kept back in school until a known adult can collect.
